

Camp Policies

All adults and campers will be expected to follow Christian conduct principles at all times.

1. **Be on time** for all meals and keep orderly lines.
2. **Campers are to be present** for all program sessions and are expected to be on time and in the appointed places when these sessions begin. Should a camper become ill any time, he/she should ask the assistance of an adult and go to the nurse. The nurse's room will be in a designated room in the worship center facility.
3. **No one may leave the campus** without permission of the camp director. No camper may leave at any time without an adult counselor. Cars must be parked and locked during the week.
4. **Dorms and grounds** are to be kept clean at all times. Morning dorm clean-ups are encouraged. **No camper will be allowed to leave campus on Friday until the campus is in order**. If any camper caused any damage, then his/her church is responsible to pay for the damage.
5. **TriQuest Ministry Youth Camp Dress Policy**: Attire should be modest and appropriate for the Christian atmosphere. The wearing of shorts shorter than 6 inches above the bottom of the knee cap, bikinis, crop-tops, tank tops, and shirts with non-Christian printing are inappropriate at all times. **We ask that shorts not be worn after 5:30 P.M. The evening dress is more of a special dress attire.** The clothes youth bring with them are what they must wear.
6. **Jewelry**: Men are not permitted to wear any type of body piercing jewelry of any kind (men are not permitted to wear earrings, pierced or non pierced). Also women are not permitted to wear any type of body piercing jewelry except jewelry suited for the earlobe only.
7. **"Lights Out"** means just that! Our schedule is a full one, with plenty of fellowship during the day. At night it is important that every camper gets the amount of needed rest to make the daytime activities more meaningful. All campers will clear the campus and be in their dorms at 10:30 PM with lights out at 11:00 AM. **THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.**
8. **No electronic devices** are to be brought to camp. (Exceptions are cell phones which must be kept in the dorm room at all times.)
9. **Fireworks, firearms or any type of weapon**, of any description will not be tolerated.

Camp Policies (continued)

10. **Tobacco in any form**, alcohol or drugs are strictly prohibited. Offenders will be sent home IMMEDIATELY!
11. **No eating or drinking** during worship services.
12. There will be no **public display of affection**.
13. **No profanity** will be tolerated.
14. Due to injuries and other problems, water balloons and shaving cream fights will not be tolerated.
15. Visitors of the opposite sex are permitted only in designated areas of the dorm.

2. Electronic devices (excluding cell phones)
3. Shorts that are more than 6 inches above the bottom of the knee cap
4. Alcoholic beverages, tobacco, or drugs
5. Midriffs, halter tops, or mini-skirts
6. Fireworks, firearms, matches or lighters

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
